MAPPING COMMUNITY RADIO STATIONS

UNESCO is mapping community radio stations which are currently broadcasting programs related to internal migration in India, or are interested in doing so in the future. RTE FOR MIGRANT CHILDREN: CONSOLIDATED REPLY

The Consolidated Reply to the Right to Education Query is now available on GYM. The responses highlighted the need to urgently mainstream migrants' children right to education, through formal and non-formal educational systems. Respondents suggested a number of key policy recommendations, including mapping migrant children, setting up a mechanism for inter-state coordination, developing a flexible school curriculum, setting up a special school-cum-day boarding with attached crèche facility, providing identification documents to migrant families, and eliminating child labour. **More:** <http://bit.ly/1Qf2Mx9>
